Traveling with Kids

Travelling with kids? Don't do it! Just kidding... Kind of.

At the Airport

- Have a bag full of tricks. If you're traveling with a child too young to distract himself, include plenty of small toys, games, stickers, magnets, and coloring books in your bag. (Once on board, don't whip them all out at once or let him rummage through -- take them out one at a time and let him play with each until he's really ready to move on to the next distraction. And leave toys that make noise at home. Your fellow travelers will thank you for it.)
- Always ask about available seats. If you didn't purchase a seat for your toddler (kids under 2 years old can sit on your lap), expect a full flight and know your chances of getting one are slim. But ask anyway.
- Take advantage of early boarding. When they make the call for travelers who need extra time to board, go for it. Use the time to stash bags where you want them before the overhead bins fill up. Get everyone situated and happy.

For the Drive

- If you're driving to your destination, do a bit of homework ahead of time to make sure that you aren't going to be on the road during heavy traffic times. If possible, avoid traveling on Fridays and Sundays if you are driving in areas with heavy traffic. It's hard to do, but by leaving really early on a Saturday morning vs. a Friday afternoon can save hours of time on the road. There is nothing worse than being stuck in traffic with small children! You don't want to make an already long trip even longer.
- Pack the car the night before and leave early in the morning when kids are in their calmest state. Leave early in the morning to avoid traffic. Do this because kids travel best in the morning. We pack the car the night before and as soon as everyone rolls out of bed we hit the road. The morning hours are always calmer times when everyone is rested and the kids are more content to relax in the car. Parents often think "let's leave in the evening so the kids will sleep on the drive..." This usually backfires.
- Don't swear at the other cars on the road because your kids will hear and they won't forget and they will remind you over and over that you said a bad word.



Ask the Expert: Traveling with Kids

Leaving the house for an errand run is already difficult when you've got children in tow. You pack the baby bag, you make sure you've got treats but what to do when you're heading off for a road trip, a weekend getaway, or a day trip to see the grandparents? Packing light isn't always an option when traveling with kids but you may be able to lessen the load with the following tips.

Book a suite

If traveling with multiple children, having the extra space will help you and your family feel more comfortable. Setting a space devoted to the kids will let you have a place for a pullout bed for a toddler or floor space to make it feel like a sleepover.

Pack some trash bags

These will help keep a hotel room dark while the little ones nap. Keep the car clean by covering the car seats when eating on the road. Or, hold wet or dirty clothes after a long day at the beach.

Ship items to your destination

When you have bigger necessities like a high chair or a Pack N' Play, checking these items for a flight or using precious cargo space on a long road trip are less than ideal. Instead, ship these items ahead of you so they're ready at the hotel or with the relatives you're visiting. You can do the same with diapers, wipes, and baby food using the many online services that will ship your items for free or little cost, if traveling domestically.

Stick to nap and bedtime routines

This will help lessen the chance of meltdowns and help transition the kids between vacation and when getting back into the groove of things once you return.

Eat where kids can play

Stop at kid-friendly eateries so the little ones can burn off excess energy after being confined on long road trips. Also a good time to make use of bathroom trips when rest stops are far and few between stops.

Get a another plane seat

Buy another seat for a flight if you can or see if you're able to get reassigned next to an empty seat when traveling with a child under age 2. The flight will go much smoother if your baby is able to relax in their car seat or in their own space. Make sure you use an FAA-approved car seat. The car seat should have a label that states "This restraint is certified for use in motor vehicles and aircraft."

Other quick and easy tips

- Pack your shoes in shower caps. Keep those dirty soles from touching clean clothes.
- Put dryer sheets in suitcases. Offset the odor of dirty clothes and prevent static.
- Use a hotel garbage can as a sink stool so the tykes can brush their teeth and wash their hands.
- Use the flexible fabric bandages from your first aid kit to cover outlets to keep kids from playing electrician
- Pack a night light to help the little ones make their middle-of-the-night bathroom runs in unfamiliar rooms.

Recipe Mama

Snowman Pizza

Kids can help!

Roll dough, make snowman and add sauce, cheese and pepperoni.



What you need:

Dough

3 1/2 Cups whole wheat flour

1 Cup white flour

2 Tsp. active dry yeast

1 Tsp. sugar

1 1/4 Tsp. salt

1 1/2 Tsp. olive oil

1/4 Tsp. garlic powder

2 Cups water

1/4 Cup grated parmesan cheese

Other ingredients:

Tomato sauce

Mozzarella cheese

Pepperoni

Capers

Carrot

Directions:

Mix dry ingredients in a large bowl. Slowly add water, a little at a time, knead until dough is firm and smooth. Using olive oil, grease bowl and place dough ball in bowl, turning once so all surfaces are oiled. Cover with a cloth or plastic wrap and let rise in a warm spot until double in size, usually about 2 hours.

Place dough on a well-floured surface and roll dough to about 1/4 inch thick. Cut out three different sizes to form each snowman, by hand or using pastry cutters. Assemble snowman on baking pan, attaching "balls" by pressing together. Add sauce, cheese and Snowman decorations. Cut pepperoni into scarves, piecing two pieces together, if necessary. Make noses by cutting tiny carrot triangles.

Hanukkah Puppy Chow

Take an old tradition of Puppy Chow and give it a Hanukkah twist with this delicious dessert snack. It's the perfect blend of salty and sweet...and a hint of blue!

INGREDIENTS

3 Tbsp. peanut butter
1 bar of nondairy white chocolate
1½ c. gluten free cereal
¼ c. powdered sugar
3 Tbsp. nondairy white chocolate chips
1 handful gluten free pretzel sticks
blue colored allergen-friendly candies (I used NoNo's)



INSTRUCTIONS

In a microwave safe bowl, warm up the peanut butter and white chocolate together until just melted.

Place the cereal in a large plastic bag, add the melted peanut butter and white chocolate to coat the cereal. Add the powdered sugar, seal, and shake vigorously until evenly coated.

Pour into a bowl, add the pretzels, white chocolate chips, and NoNo's (or other blue-colored candies).







Felt Creations!

How To Make a Felt Christmas Tree (or any holiday symbol)

You'll need a few supplies for this Christmas craft.

Supplies:

- Green felt (approximately a yard)
- Various colors of felt for decorations
- Scissors
- Cardboard or Card Stock
- Glitter glue, sequins, or other accessories for decorating
- Adhesive strips or Velcro strips



Directions: Draw your tree outline on the green felt.

You should be able to find the large felt on rolls at your local craft or sewing store. The easiest way to draw your tree is to fold the felt in half and draw the outline on the one side of the fold so that when you cut it out each side is exactly the same.

Use the cardboard or card stock to make a template for your ornaments. An easy way to make a circle ornament is to find a cup or glass around your home and trace the circle so it's perfectly round.

If you want to get a little creative you can do different decorations besides just round ornaments. If you have large cookie cutters you can trace those for ornaments. Other things you could include on your tree are teddy bears, snowmen, hearts, presents, candy canes, and Christmas lights.

You will also want a star or other topper for the top of the Christmas tree as well.

Once you have all your templates made then trace them onto the felt and cut them out.

You can use them just as they are as plain decorations or you can use glitter glue, puffy paint, sequins or other items to decorate the ornaments as you want. You can also use the other felt pieces you have to embellish the ornaments as well.
